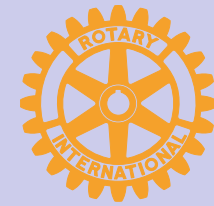

How We Work

The Club is split into the following committees which help us to successfully deliver our annual programme:

Social & Fundraising - This committee is really at the heart of the Club, organising all the social events and, most important of all, being responsible for raising the funds so that all the other committees can deliver their programmes each year!

Community & Vocation - This is the traditional and well known face of Rotary, which offers help and assistance to those in need in the local community either directly or through local charitable organisations.

Youth Service - The Youth Service work of Rotary is specifically targeted at youngsters within the community. It seeks to recognize and celebrate the achievements of young people and also to identify and develop their leadership skills.

International - Works to give help and assistance directly to those individuals and countries where major disasters have happened throughout the world. It also carries out work as part of other humanitarian and educational projects often in developing countries.

Foundation - Is Rotary International's charity which aims to achieve world understanding and peace through international humanitarian, educational and cultural exchange programmes. One major humanitarian programme is PolioPlus, which seeks to eradicate the Polio virus worldwide.

Membership - Deals with the general running of the Club and the welfare of our members. This covers all publicity aspects together with the speaker and inter club sports programme.
